Proceeding of the review meeting on implementation of "Special programme for promotion of millets in tribal areas of Odisha / Odisha Millet Mission" held on 14.11.2018 in the Conference Hall of Planning & Convergence Department under the chairmanship of Development Commissioner -cum- Additional Chief Secretary

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A review meeting on implementation of "Special programme for promotion of millets in tribal areas of Odisha / Odisha Millet Mission" was held on 14.11.2018 in the Conference Hall of Planning & Convergence Department under the chairmanship of Development Commissioner -cum- Additional Chief Secretary, Government of Odisha. List of the members present in the meeting is annexed.

At the outset, Director of Agriculture & Food Production, Odisha welcomed the participants and made presentation on the following aspects: -

1. Objectives of the Odisha Millets Mission.
2. Scale of the Odisha Millets Mission.
3. Crop coverage under improved agronomic practices during Kharif 2018-19.
4. Area, Yield and Production information of Ragi in the 8 procurement districts.
5. Scale of Procurement and inclusion of Ragi in State Nutrition Programmes (SNPs) & PDS.
6. Tentative dateline for finalization of the list of procurement centres
7. Expected date to start Ragi procurement
8. Status of Ragi Farmers' Registration in the 8 procurement districts.
9. Status of TDCCOL godowns in the 8 procurement districts.

Director of Agriculture and Food production, Odisha stated that Odisha Millets Mission is now extended to 72 blocks covering 14 districts. Crop achievement has been made in 12,334 Ha under "Improved Agronomic Practices" as against the target of 16000 Ha. Ragi farmers' registration for procurement has been initiated in 8 districts, namely Gajapati, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Koraput, Malkangiri, Nuapada, Rayagada and Sundergarh.

Total Crop coverage under Ragi in those 8 procurement districts is 92,865 Ha with average yield of 864 Kg/Ha and total production in these 8 districts is expected to be 8,02,400 quintals. Out of 8,02,400 quintals, target for procurement of Ragi during KMS 2018-19 is 1,88,000 quintals.

22714 Ragi farmers have been registered under Millet Procurement Automation System (MPAS) in the TDCCOL portal as on 13.11.2018 for procurement through PACS. Bank account and land verification of registered farmers is still in process. Last date for completion of Farmers' Registration process is November 30<sup>th</sup> 2018.

Based on the feedback from the ATMA, it is estimated that 76000 quintals may be available for procurement. Capacity of TDCCOL godowns in these districts is 1,65,000 Quintals. There is enough storage space in the godowns of TDCCOL. A district level committee will be formed to assess the condition of the godowns.

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List of procurement centres and date of procurement shall be finalised in the District Level Procurement Committee (DLPC) under the chairmanship of Collector & District Magistrate of respective districts.

Procurement is expected to start in all districts from 1<sup>st</sup> week of December onwards except Sundergarh district and Rakia block in Kandhamal District. Procurement is expected to begin in Sundergarh in the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of December 2018. Procurement in Indiragarh LAMPS of Raikia block of Kandhamal District will begin from 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 onwards. A meeting will be convened during mid-December to decide the quantity of Ragi procurement.

Director, NCDS stated that honorarium and facilitation costs provided to Facilitating Agencies (FAs) & Community Resource Persons (CRPs) under Community Based Organizations (CBOs) may be delinked from the programme expenditure to avoid delay in payment.

Development Commissioner cum Additional Chief Secretary suggested that incentives must be given to the farmers in time. He asked D.A. & F.P.(O) to monitor such cases and direct the concerned Deputy Director Agriculture to follow the guidelines & decisions taken by the Government. Director of Agriculture and Food production, Odisha informed that a financial manual has been prepared with these considerations. As per discussion with Finance Department, Statement of Expenditure (SoE) and Utilisation Certificate (UC) can be submitted and original bills can be retained at the FA level. Inter componental changes will be done after approval of Collector and District Magistrate. This is in-line with the financial rules of Government of Odisha. Principal Secretary, A & FE stated that financial manual and process manual should take care of these issues.

Director, NCDS expressed that most of the OMM farmers in Nuapada district could not sow millets during Kharif 2018 due to long dry spell and suggested that they may be given incentive for adopting improved agronomic practices in subsequent years. Finance Secretary suggested that such provision can be made and appropriate support can be provided.

Director, NCDS further informed that as per their estimate, total number of Ragi farmers in the 8 districts will be around 2 lakhs. As on date, only 22,714 farmers have been registered. It is important to ensure that registration process is carried out earlier in the next years. In addition, other minor millets apart from Ragi should also be considered for procurement. The benchmark price for little millet and foxtail millet may be considered following the cost of calculation prepared by NCDS in association with OUAT.

Additional Chief Secretary, Finance suggested that other minor millets such as little millet & foxtail millet should be included in the ICDS and MDM as rice can be substituted by these. These may be considered for procurement from FY 2019-20 onwards.

DC cum ACS said that farmer registration activities may be carried out earlier next year. But focus of procurement is to ensure MSP /good remunerative price to ragi farmers.

However, it will not be practically possible for Government to procure from all farmers when the local market price is closer to MSP.

Principal Secretary, A & FE stated that local market price has picked up in comparison to last year which may be in anticipation of the government procurement. In Sundergarh and in certain blocks of Rayagada, price of Ragi is currently over Rs 3000 per quintal, which is above MSP (Rs 2897/- per quintal). He further informed that EFC on extension of implementation of Odisha Millets Mission and procurement and distribution of Ragi in ICDS and PDS has been placed for Government approval.

State Coordinator, WASSAN informed that Government of India has recommended all other states to adopt the model of Odisha Millets Mission for promotion of millets, pulses and oilseeds. Government of Karnataka and Maharashtra appreciated the efforts taken by Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Empowerment for promotion of millets in the State of Odisha and desired to follow up in the lines of Odisha Millets Mission. State Coordinator, WASSAN further informed that promotion of millets through SHGs has been discussed with Mission Shakti. One MoA in this regard may be signed between the Mission Shakti and Odisha Millets Mission.

DC cum ACS suggested that two minute short clipping should be prepared highlighting the achievements Odisha Millets Mission and it is to be ensured before Hockey World Cup.

State Coordinator, WASSAN requested that various agro ecological initiatives such as Odisha Millets Mission, Integrated Farming, PKVY, etc. may be integrated and convergence may be made with similar initiatives in other department/agencies like OLM, OPELIP, OTELP, FADP, etc. DC cum ACS said that Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Empowerment may develop appropriate structure or design and put up for discussion in the next High Powered Committee meeting.

After a threadbare discussion in the meeting, following decisions were taken:-

1. UC & Statement of Expenditure (SoE) shall be submitted by the stakeholders against the funds transferred.
2. The Financial Manual prepared by D.A. & F.P.(O) may be adhered to by all concerned.
3. Honorarium and facilitation cost to FAs & Community Resource Persons (CRPs) under Community Based Organizations (CBOs) shall be paid regularly.
4. All millet farmers adopting Improved Agronomic Practices of OMM should be covered under DBT incentive.
5. Ragi Farmers' Registration activities may be carried out earlier in the cropping season to ensure higher registration next year.



6. Procurement of little millet and foxtail millet shall start from KMS 2019-20. Benchmark price will be finalized by the committee under the chairmanship of Director of Agriculture and Food Production, Odisha, Bhubaneswar.
7. "Committee on processing machinery" may be formed under chairmanship of D.A. & F.P.(O) with members from IIMR, OUAT, NCDS and other members to finalise technical specifications of the machines.
8. Purchase of one or two machines for laddoo making, roti making, small scale dehullers, etc. may be procured on pilot basis from funds available under component 2.2 or funds under innovation with Programme Secretariat.
9. Appropriate Crop insurance scheme may be introduced for millets from FY 2019-20. Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Empowerment may appraise to Government of India in this regard.
10. A complete processing unit should be established in Bhubaneswar/Urban locations in the programme districts with Mission Shakti SHGs from the funds available under component 2.2. The locations may be finalised in consultation with Mission Shakti.
11. Expenditure for arrangement of stall with Mission Shakti during Hockey World Cup 2018 may be made from the Innovation funds with Programme Secretariat.
12. One MoA may be signed between Mission Shakti and Odisha Millets Mission for promotion of millets and Millet products developed by SHGs. The value added products of millets may be made available in OMFED outlets, Reliance outlets, etc. Programme Secretariat to liaise with Mission Shakti to develop the proposal.
13. Proposal for Convergence with Odisha Livelihood Mission may be developed.
14. Proposal for integration of various agro ecological initiatives such as Odisha Millets Mission, Integrated Farming, PKVY, etc. and convergence with similar initiatives in other Department/agencies like OLM, OPELIP, OTELP, FADP, etc. may be considered.
